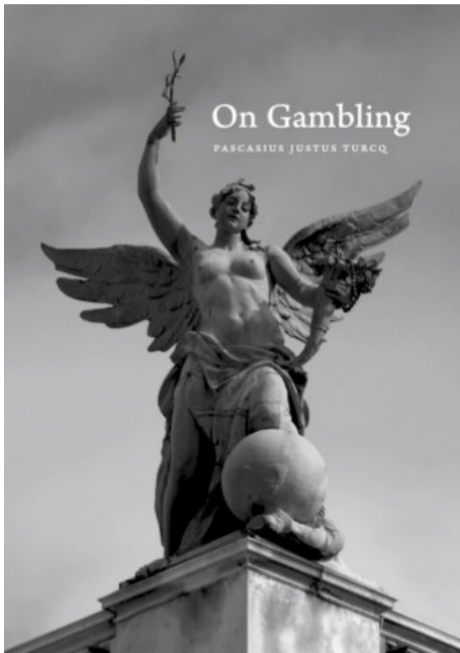

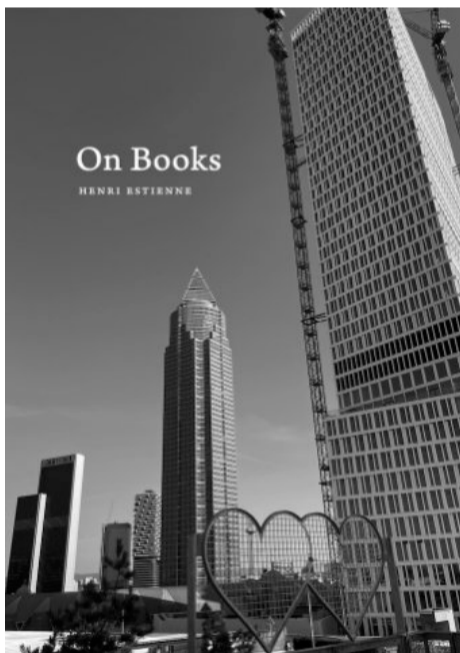

Pascasius Justus Turcq from Eeklo became the mayor of Bergen-op-Zoom, where he worked as a physician and in 1582 helped saving the life of William the Silent. Alongside tales of gambling princes and perceptive accounts of the mental suffering experienced by problem gamblers, Pascasius' *De alea* is remarkable for its singular insights into 16th-century medical science. It proposes a novel description of compulsive gambling as a psychological disorder and articulates a series of pioneering cures.
